- **Clean Air Action Plan (2006, 2010, 2017)**

The CAAP is a “living document” that has been revised twice since its original release in 2006. Elizabeth coordinated with the ports, other local business and community organizations, to review and revise existing and proposed planning documents, and develop consensus on an environmental stewardship outreach plan which includes an integrated planning approach to achieve both environmental and economic port goals and strategies.

Due to Elizabeth’s leadership, FuturePorts was appointed by Mayor Antonio Villaraigosa of the City of Los Angeles, and Mayor Bob Foster of the City of Long Beach, to the Joint Mayor’s CAAP Stakeholder Advisory Committee in 2006.

- **Clean Trucks Program**

Due to Elizabeth’s efforts, FuturePorts was part of the port stakeholder group that received the US EPA Region 9 National Environmental Justice Achievement Award for this project. The EPA commended the port stakeholder group that helped develop the trucking program and collaborated to replace thousands of aging, exhaust-spewing trucks with new, clean big-rigs. The program is producing “immediate and ongoing environmental benefits” for local neighborhoods, the EPA said.
